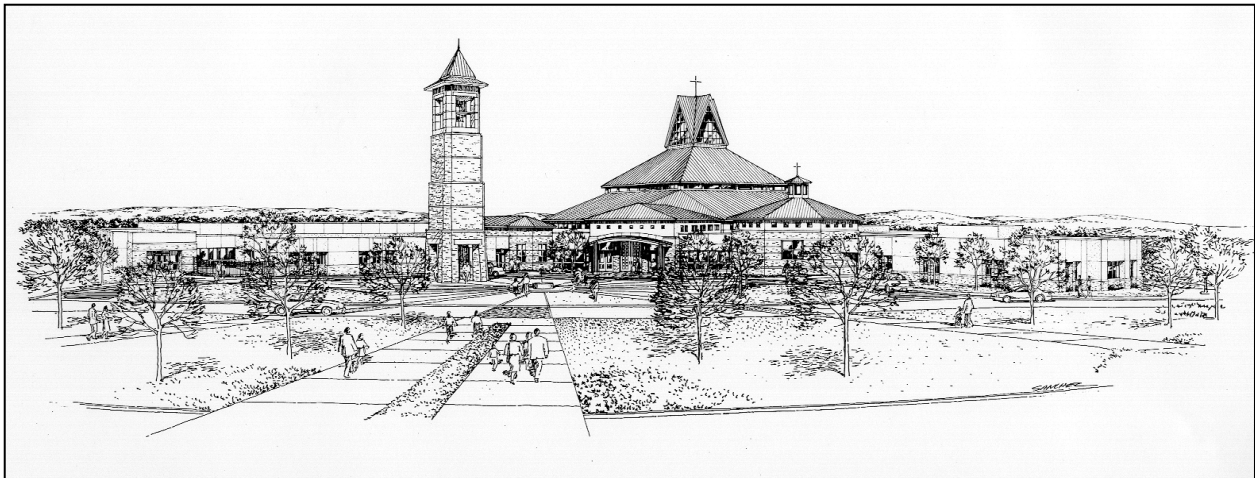
PARISH HISTORY

The Cathedral of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish has the distinction of being the newest and largest parish in the Diocese of Dodge City. It began its existence as a multi-cultural congregation. Masses were celebrated in English, Spanish and Vietnamese.

The parish was erected December 9, 2001, when Sacred Heart Cathedral and Our Lady of Guadalupe parishes formally consolidated. This idea surfaced during a three-year diocesan restructuring process that began in 1995. Both parishes growth demanded larger churches and the diocese needed a larger worship space and facilities for diocesan liturgies. The new 1,400 seat cathedral was constructed and named for the patroness of the diocese.

On the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Dec. 12, three days after the dedication of the Cathedral, the two Catholic congregations gathered for prayer in their respective churches. A procession led by matachines dancers started from Our Lady of Guadalupe Church and traveled to Sacred Heart Cathedral. The two congregations melded into one and braved snow and northerly winds of 17 miles an hour during the three-mile pilgrimage to the new cathedral. More than 300 people made the pilgrimage. Those who experienced the 20 degree wind-chill were welcomed by the warmth of the new cathedral. The pilgrims swelled the awaiting congregation to well over 1,500.

The first parish Mass was bilingual with Father Ted Skalsky presiding, Father Ted Stoecklein concelebrating, and Deacon Erasmo Rodriguez assisting. The liturgy was celebrated in the presence of Bishop Ronald M. Gilmore.

BAPTISM PREPARATION

Pre-baptism instruction is designed to enable the members of each baptism team (Parents and Godparents) to live a good Christian example which edifies, strengthens and sanctifies the newly born child of God. The same basic syllabus is offered in English and Spanish. A total of 4 hours of instruction (2 classes) is required to complete the course. The instruction is based on Holy Scripture, Christian Tradition and Divine Revelation as experienced within the Church.

FIRST COMMUNION

Children in the parish prepare to receive their first reconciliation and first communion in the second grade. Sacred Heart students are prepared through school religion class. Children not attending Sacred Heart will be required two years of classes for preparation for the sacraments. Call the Office: 225-4802

CONFIRMATION

The norm for the Diocese of Dodge City, is to prepare students to be confirmed in the 7th grade. Confirmation is a beginning of life-long faith development that they assume as a mature person. Students who are active members of the parish are eligible to be confirmed. The candidates are asked to participate in Generations of Faith program and to participate in a series of pre-confirmation classes.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INIATION OF ADULTS

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) is the Church's ritual process for calling adults to a conversion of heart and mind and preparing them for a full and active life in the Church as disciples of Jesus. The process of becoming a Catholic involves more than just learning about the faith of the Church. The R.C.I.A. aims to transform the entire person into an individual who has truly put on Christ Jesus. Contact: Coleen Stein 227-1538

RCIA (FOR CHILDREN)

This ministry is for the children age 7, or older, who have not been baptized. Children who enter the process of preparation for Baptism are in a two year process which completes by receiving Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. Parents of the children are asked to participate in a retreat to strengthen

the faith of the family. We gather with the adults and then dismiss into a separate group for sessions on a level of understanding suited for the age of children within the group. They are in need of sponsors, leaders, and folks who just want to volunteer to walk with a child in this faith journey.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION

Marriage is the celebration of a sacrament. The Diocese norm requires the couple to contact the priest or deacon at least four months prior to the wedding. The bride or groom must be registered in our parish. Couples from another parish, must have permission of their pastor to begin preparation work. The couple must meet with the priest, take the FOCUS marriage inventory, and attend an Engaged Encounter Weekend. The minimum age for marriage is 17. Contact Office: 225-4802

PARISH COUNCILS & COMMITTEES

PASTORAL COUNCIL

The Pastoral Council shares the responsibility for building the parish into vibrant Christian community that promotes the parish mission and the Gospel values of love, justice, and peace. It is an advisory body of leaders who actively seek the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and are guided by the teachings, laws and recommendations of the universal church and the Diocese of Dodge City. There is both an English and a Spanish Pastoral Council. Occasionally, joint meetings are planned.

FINANCE COUNCIL

The finance committee's responsibility is overseeing stewardship of treasure, physical plant and financial policies. PROPERTY COMMITTEE

This commission is responsible for all three of our facilities. Landscaping is the largest project. It entails not only the green fescue surrounding the facilities but the buffalo grass in front and on both sides of the driveway, the shelter belt north of the church, the living snow fence north of Iron Road, and the water control pond on the west side of the property. Nearly all the work has been donated including mowing and trimming every week, mulching, weed control, fertilizing, back filling dirt, leveling and shaping, and manual watering where needed. LITURGY COMMISSION

This group is responsible, along with the priest, to promote the liturgical and spiritual life of the parish community. They do this by helping in the preparation of the liturgy and worship environment. ART & ENVIRONMENT

This committee works with the Liturgy Committee for the purpose of decorating the church. The group is responsible for ordinary time, as well as, the special masses during Advent, Christmas, Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. They plan and order plants, flowers, decorations, etc. for the altar and gathering area. This also includes *un-decorating* and organizing supplies to be stored for future events. LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

Parish liturgical ministers play an important role in the life of the parish community. Liturgical ministers help make our worship prayerful and reverent. You are encouraged to reflect upon the God-given gifts you possess and use these gifts for the benefit of the whole community. All ministers should remember that they undertake a visible role in the faith community. Therefore, their lives should give witness to the values we hold as a Catholic people. ALTAR SERVER

Servers can be either boys or girls. In the Spanish-speaking community, children have begun serving after making their First Communion. In English Masses, servers begin in the fifth grade. Periodic trainings take place to keep the servers informed as changes occur in the Mass Rites.

GREETER

Greeters are often the first impression visitors and life long members have of our parish family. Greeters are asked to be at Mass 30 minutes before mass to welcome and greet parishioners and guests. It is their job to make our service welcoming to those who enter. They also have the responsibility of selecting someone to be the gift bearer for the Mass. Contact Office: 225-4802

LECTOR

There are two lectors scheduled for each weekend mass. The lector is provided with the scripture readings to prepare to share the Word of God at the Mass. People who love the Scriptures and who can proclaim the Word of God are encouraged to undertake this ministry. Contact Office: 225-4802

SACRISTAN

The sacristan prepares for the celebration of Mass by setting out the sacred vessels, the linens and the liturgical books. They also assure that all ministry positions are filled. Contact Office: 225-4802

USHER

The ushers are responsible to guide individuals to available seating and assist elderly or handicapped individuals. They also help with the circulation of the collections baskets. Following Mass they help distribute bulletins and place the collection in locked bags. Contact Office: 225-4802

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTER

Eucharist Ministers are a very large portion of our ministry needs for Masses. Many are also sharing the Eucharist with those in the hospital, homebound, and those in nursing homes. It takes approximately sixty-five Eucharistic Ministers each weekend. We also need ministers for daily Masses, funerals, and Sacred Heart School Masses and home bound.

PRAYER

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

The Cathedral of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish has Perpetual Adoration of the Eucharist—24 hours a day, 365 days a year—the chapel is located on the other side of the stone wall behind the tabernacle. 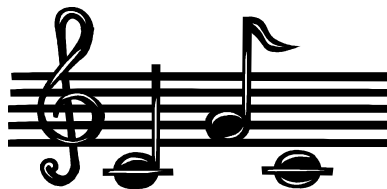

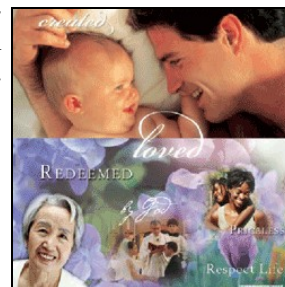

THE KANSAS BENEFIT BANK

The Kansas Benefit Bank provides low income families a way to increase their access to State and Federal health, child nutrition and poverty reduction programs, thus enabling them to begin to break the cycle of hunger and poverty. Volunteers are needed to work as counselors, using computers at the Parish offices, or at Catholic Charities.

Volunteer counselors meet with low income families and senior citizens to help them apply for Federal and State tax refunds, and to help determine their eligibility for Food Stamps, Child Care Subsidy, Low-Income Energy Assistance, medical and other benefits. Counselors use a computer program to guide each applicant through a step-by-step interview process to file tax returns and prepare benefit applications. All volunteers receive training and support as they learn to operate The Benefit Bank software.

Even though Federal and State benefits are available to assist the working poor, many families in need continue to struggle without receiving the assistance for which they are actually qualified.
